1. 2.0 Grade Point Average (4.0 scale).

Admission requirements to the Communication Disorders and Sciences (Speech Pathology and Audiology) program. (Note: Admission to the University does not guarantee admission into this program.)

1. Obtain a 2.75 cumulative GPA or higher on all lower division coursework.

## **NOTES:**

- 1. Students may choose MATH 115 or MATH 161 to fulfill EIU requirements. MATH 161 is recommended for any student who plans to get a Master's degree in the future.
- 2. BIOL 136 and BIOL 137 or GSCI 105 fulfill the Human Anatomy requirement at EIU. GSCI 105 does not fulfill the AA graduation requirement at DACC. If a student chooses to take GSCI 105, he/she will be encouraged to take another elective course at DACC.
- 3. Recommended elective courses that may benefit students are EDUC 211, PSYC or SOCY course, HLTH 102, HLTH 101, or HLTH 130.
- 4. At EIU, all students must have completed a foreign language in either high school or college. This requirement may be met by completing two years of a single foreign language in high school with a grade of C or better, or two semesters of a single foreign language in college. If this requirement was met in high school, the student can choose an elective course.
