Transfer Admission Requirements

Minimum G.P.A. of 2.4 if pre-req's are not met or if space in major isn't available.

Admission Criteria to the History/Social Science Education Program

(Admission to the University does not guarantee admission to the History/Social Science Education Program.)

- 1. Complete 30 credit hours or more of college-level coursework.
- 2. Transfer students need to have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (4.0 scale) or higher for admission into this program.
- 3. Obtain a grade of C or better in Rhetoric 101 and 102, and Speech 101 or 102.
- 4. For the Teacher Licensing, the State of Illinois will accept the ACT-Plus Writing, with a composite score of 22 and English and Writing combined score of 19; SAT score of 1030 in Critical Reading and Math and a score of 450 in Writing; or the requirement can be met by passing all parts of the Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP).

To become a licensed/certified teacher in the State of Illinois, an individual must pass at least three state exams:

- As of June 30, 2019, the Test of Basic Skills is no longer required to obtain an educator licensure.
 This includes the SAT and ACT exams. For more information, visit

ISU requires three (3) years of one foreign language in high school <u>or</u> completion of the third semester or higher of college-level foreign language with a passing grade or equivalent proficiency as determined by examination. If requirements have been met, it is recommended that students take PSYC 100 or a Social Science elective.
