

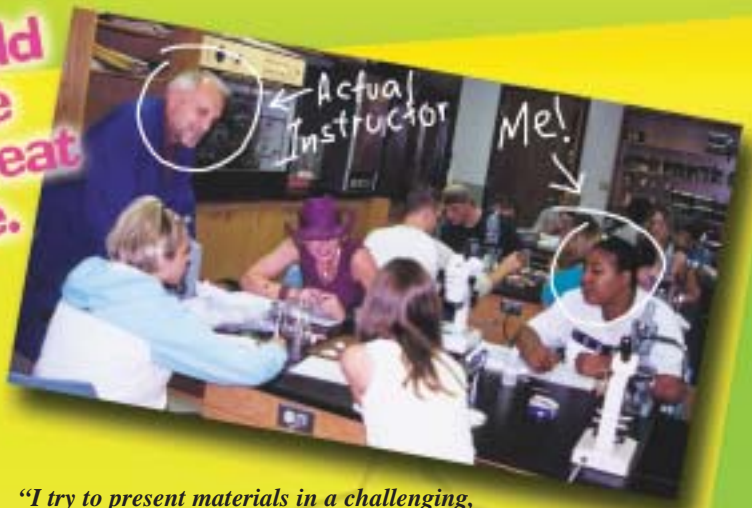

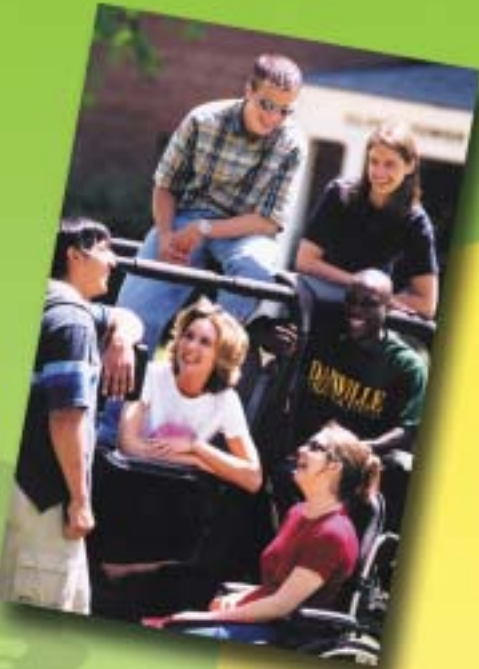
DACC's state-of-the-art facilities include:

Online Learning

DACC offers both degree credit and career programs. Whether you intend to earn a Bachelor's degree, an Associate degree or just want some additional training before you enter the real world, DACC can help. Nearly 35% of the district's high school graduates attend DACC for their first two years.

Dual Enrollment

For high school students who want a JUMP START on college, DACC offers many dual enrollment opportunities, both on campus and in area high schools. With dual enrollment you earn college credit while still enrolled in high school. Talk to your high school guidance counselor, or call DACC at **217.443.DACC** for information about dual enrollment opportunities.

2 + 2 = 4 (Transfer Programs)

You can earn an Associate in Science and Arts degree (ASA) or an Associate in Engineering Science degree (AES) in one of 50 baccalaureate/transfer majors while completing the first two years of your Bachelor's degree. The GPA's of students who transfer from DACC to a state university are typically as good as or better than the GPA's of students who start at the university.

DACC's counselors and academic advisors work with you to ensure your courses are satisfying the requirements of the college or university you have chosen. The College guarantees that any DACC counselor/advisor-approved course will transfer to the college or university you have chosen or your tuition and fees for that course will be refunded. Course approval must be certified each semester by completing the Transfer Credit Guarantee form with your counselor.
