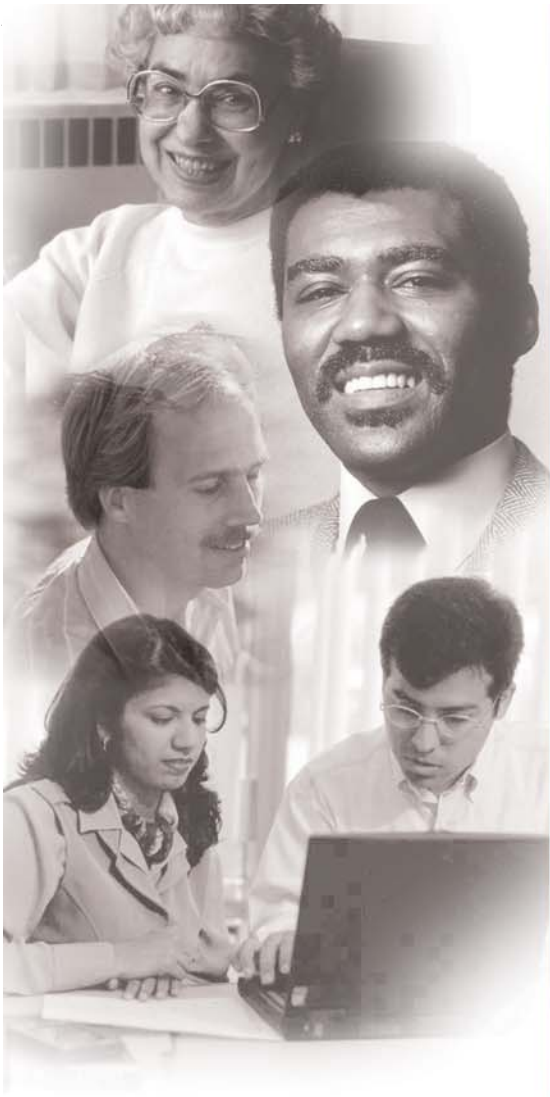

Eligibility Requirements for taking the GED Test:

Individuals are eligible to apply for taking the GED test in the country where they live if they meet the following qualifications:

- 18 years of age or older, not a high school graduate and the high school class he/she would have graduated with has graduated
- 17 years of age or older and he/she is a member of the armed forces
- 17 years of age and he/she is a ward of the Department of Corrections or an inmate
- 17 years of age and he/she is a parent
- 17 years of age and he/she has been out of school for one year

GED Test Elements:

With the exception of Part II of the Writing Skills Test, which requires an essay, all questions on the GED Test are multiple choice. An applicant shall make on each of the five tests a standard score of 410 or above and a total standard score of at least 2250 on the entire battery (average score of 450 on all tests).

- Language Arts, Writing Test Part I
- Language Arts, Writing Test Part II
- Language Arts (Reading Test)
- Social Studies
- Mathematics
- Science
- U.S. Constitution
