## Level I Nursing Graduates Continue Perfect Trend

The faculty and staff of the School of Nursing would like to announce a 100% pass rate for 2010 Level I graduates who have taken the National Licensure Examination for Practical Nursing (NCLEX-PN). The DACC NCLEX-PN pass rate has been 100% since May 2006. One-hundred and eighty-four Level I graduates have taken the test and 184 have passed. This statistic speaks to the quality of education at DACC. The School of Nursing would like to thank everyone involved in the educational process of the nursing students.

## Student Text-Message Alerts

**This is a reminder that ALL students, faculty, and staff are cleared out of the emergency text message system every August. This is to delete students, faculty, and staff that are no longer associated with DACC. If you previously signed up for emergency text messaging and you wish to be on the list, you MUST sign up again. Go to the DACC website, click on either "students" or "employees", click on the "sign up for emergency text message alerts", and follow the instructions.**

DACC offers an Emergency Text Messaging alert system to students, faculty, and staff to be used in the event of a potential, developing, or existing on campus emergency, or advisories about closings and/or class cancellations, possibly due to inclement weather. There is no charge for signing up; however, standard text messaging rates from your cell phone service provider will apply. Emergency Text Messaging is just one of the methods DACC will use to communicate emergency information to students, faculty, and staff. We will continue to use a variety of other methods as appropriate, including email, posting on the DACC website, and local radio and television stations. You will then be asked for your cell phone number, and for your permission to add that number to the system. Important! You will be asked for a password. That password will allow you to manage your text-messaging account later, if you need to change your cell phone number (for example). Do not use the same password that you use for your DACC account.

## Important Admissions Information:

### Drop/Refund Policy:

For Classes that Meet 12 Weeks or Longer: If the student drops during the first two weeks of class, tuition and course fees paid or payable will be refunded.

For Classes that Meet Less than 12 Weeks: If the student drops during the first week of class, tuition and course fees paid or payable will be refunded. Please note: Drop/ Refund deadlines are adjusted when holidays occur during the drop/refund timeframe.

### Withdrawal Policy

For classes that meet 5 weeks or longer, students may withdraw from a course up until the end of the week that 75% of the course has been completed (according to course start and end dates). For classes that meet 4 weeks or less, students may withdraw up until the Friday prior to the end of the course. Since start/end dates vary, withdrawal dates will be posted every semester. **It is the student's responsibility to know the dates.**
