Minimum G.P.A. of 2.75.

Admission Criteria to the History/Social Science Education Program

(Admission to the University does not guarantee admission to the History/Social Science Education Program.)

1. Complete 30 credit hours or more of college-level coursework.
2. a. To become a licensed/certified teacher in the State of Illinois and individual must pass, at least, three (3) State exams:
 - Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP)
 - Assessment of Professional Teacher Skills (APT) Test
 - Content Area Test

3. Transfer students need to have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (4.0 scale) or higher for admission into this program.
4. Obtain a grade of C or better in Rhetoric 101 and 102, and Speech 101 or 102.
5. For the Teacher Licensing, the State of Illinois will accept the ACT-Plus Writing, with a composite score of 22 and English and Writing combined score of 19; SAT score of 1030 in Critical Reading and Math and a score of 450 in Writing; or the requirement can be met by passing all parts of the Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP).

Notes:

1. ISU requires three (3) years of one foreign language in high school **or** completion of the third semester or higher of college-level foreign language with a passing grade or equivalent proficiency as determined by examination. If requirements have been met, it is recommended that students take CECN 102, CECN 103, and EDUC 211.
