## **Transfer Admission Requirements:**

1. 2.0 GPA (4.0 scale). 2.2 for CRIM courses.

## **Notes:**

1. Only grades of C or better will transfer.
2. This program provides a suitable major for students who wish to pursue:
  - Law School
  - Adult and Juvenile Probation/Parole
  - Adult/Juvenile Corrections
  - Law Enforcement (City, County, State, and Federal)
  - Delinquency control/prevention programs
  - Criminal justice planning agencies involved in planning, research, and evaluation studies.
  - Safety/security positions in industrial, commercial, and retail organizations.
3. Suggested Science Electives: PHYS 106, 141, 142, 143 and BIOL 100 or 101.
4. If two or more years of a single foreign language (C's or better) are completed in high school, then the student is exempt for this requirement; however, the student must substitute these hours with elective credit hours to complete degree. Suggested electives: SOCY 225 and CBUS 150 for Criminal Law. CRIM 170 and CRIM 180 for Corrections/Parole.
5. A junior-senior online degree completion is available for Criminology through Indiana State University.
6. If doing Law Enforcement, take CRIM 103. If doing Corrections/Parole, take CRIM 105.
7. Elective only required if student needs additional credit hours to reach 60. SOCY 225 is suggested.
