Transfer Admission Requirements:

- 1. Competitive GPA; generally a 2.5 GPA (4.0 scale). Students who are above a 2.0 GPA, but do not meet the competitive GPA, will typically be waitlisted and asked to write a personal statement.
- 2. Must be in good standing with pervious schools attended.

Notes:

- 1. If student had four (4) years of one foreign language in high school, with no grade lower than a C, then the foreign language requirement will have been met. Otherwise, student must complete four (4) semesters of college foreign language. If foreign language requirement is met, then the student may substitute elective courses to obtain the sixty (60) hours required. Suggestions for substitute courses are: SOCY 202, SOCY 205, SOCY 225, SOCY 230, CRIM 100, CRIM 105, CRIM 170, CRIM 180, or CRIM 204.
- 2. If the student does not take SPAN 104 due to fulfilling foreign language requirement in high school, then student will need to take a humanities or fine arts elective in its place.
- 3. For the B.S. degree, MATH 135 Intro to Analysis II (Finite Math) and MATH 120 Calculus I are required.
- 4. Recommended Life Science courses: BIOL 100, BIOL 101, BIOL 102, BIOL 105.
- 5. Recommended Physical Science courses: CHEM 100, CHEM 101, PHYS 114, PHYS 143.
- 6. Recommended Fine Arts courses: ARTS 105, ARTS 112, ARTS, 115, MUSI 115, MUSI 120.
- 7. Recommended Humanities courses: LITR 103, PHIL 101, PHIL 102, PHIL 103.
- 8. Recommended Social Science courses: ANTH 103, ANTH 107, GEOG 134, POLI 150, POLI 160, PSYC 100, PSYC 210, CECN 108, CECN 102, CECN 103.
- 9. Sociology elective courses include: CRIM 100, CRIM 170, CRIM 105, CRIM 180, CRIM 204, SOCY 200, SOCY 201, SOCY 205, SOCY 220, SOCY 225, SOCY 230.
