1. 2.0 Grade Point Average (4.0 scale).
2. Admission to the College of Education does not guarantee admission to the teacher education program.

## **Admission to the Teacher Education Program**

*(Admission to the College of Education does not guarantee admission to the teacher education program.)*

Students are eligible to make formal application to the program with:

1. An overall grade point average of at least 2.75 (4.0 Scale).
2. Completion of ENGL 101 and ENGL 102 with a grade of C or better.
3. Two letters of recommendation from college or university faculty (transfer students may bring letters of recommendation from school(s) previously attended).
4.
  - a. For the Teacher Licensing, the State of Illinois will accept the ACT-Plus Writing, with a composite score of 22 and English and Writing combined score of 19; SAT score of 1030 in Critical Reading and Math and a score of 450 in Writing; or the requirement can be met by passing all parts of the Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP).
  - b. To become a licensed/certified teacher in the State of Illinois and individual must pass, at least, three (3) State exams:
    - Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP)
    - Assessment of Professional Teacher Skills (APT) Test
    - Content Area Test

## **NOTES:**

1. Students are required to take one of the following Physical Science courses: CHEM 100, PHYS 101, or PHYS 143.
2. All teacher certification majors are required to take a three-hour course in Third World or Non-Western Culture, either in Humanities or Social Science. Choose from LITR 104, LITR 106, SOCY 225, or PHIL 104.
3. Recommended Humanities and Fine Arts courses: ARTS 105, ARTS 115, ARTS 111, ARTS 112, LITR 105, HUMN 101, MUSI 115, PHIL 101, PHIL 102, or PHIL 103.
4. Recommended electives include: EDUC 211, BMGT 200, or PEMW 153.
