## **Transfer Admission Requirements:**

1. 2.5 GPA (4.0 scale).

### **Notes:**

1. The Criminal Justice curriculum is designed to give students the academic background and initial training for careers in law enforcement. Entry into the program is determined through the evaluation of personal qualifications and after the screening of an application which states that the student has no felony convictions.
2. All Law Enforcement and Justice Administration majors at Western must declare an approved minor (16-20 hours). Fire Administration, Security Administration, Forensic Chemistry, and Forensic Science are available as minors.
3. The Associate in Applied Science degree does not receive benefits of the Compact Agreement nor the IAI General Education Core Curriculum. Students will be awarded junior class standing, but will be required to complete WIU General Education requirements (43 hours) to include a three-hour writing emphasis course.
4. All students are required to complete 60 semester hours at a four-year institution, 40 of which must be in upper division course work (300/400 level), and 30 of which must be at WIU; and pass a University writing exam as a WIU graduation requirement.
