Transfer Admission Requirements:

1. Bachelor in Fine Arts with Teacher Education option:
 - a. 2.65 Grade Point Average (4.0) and maintain a 3.0 to continue in program.
 - b. All students must pass the Illinois Licensure Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP). Students can substitute ACT plus Writing or SAT scores for the TAP if they meet the minimum scores set by the Illinois State Board of Education. These scores can be found at <http://www.eiu.edu/ceps/teached> or by contacting the CEPS Dean's Office. Students should complete this requirement no later than their sophomore year.
 - c. Completion of Speech and Hearing Clearance, contact EIU's Speech, Language, and Hearing Clinic for an appointment.
 - d. A criminal background check and several other requirements must be successfully completed while at EIU prior to student teaching.
 - e. Formal Application to the Teacher Education Program.
 - f. A grade of C or better is required for all course work.
2. For Art History and Graphic Design: 2.0 overall Grade Point Average (4.0 scale).
3. For Studio Art: 2.25 overall Grade Point Average (4.0 scale). 2.75 for art courses.
4. For Studio Art and Graphic Design: Successful Portfolio Review

NOTES:

1. Required for Art Education only.
2. Art History Majors are recommended to take HIST 111 Western Civilization I and HIST 112 Western Civilization II. Art Education majors must take POLI 150 American Government and PSYC 101 Child Development.
3. At EIU, all students must have completed a foreign language in either high school or college. This requirement may be met by completing two years of a single foreign language in high school or by completing the second semester of a single foreign language in college with a C or better. Art History majors are required to complete through the fourth year/semester of a single foreign language.
4. DACC does not offer several courses that are required for EIU's unique art programs, including ART 2500 Health and Safety in the Visual Arts and ART 2560 Printmaking. **In addition, EIU's unusual requirement of establishing an EIU GPA prior to taking junior-level art courses will result in three (3) years of study at EIU (5 years total college).**
5. Students pursuing Studio Art and Art Education should take ARTS 141. Student pursuing Studio Art 2D and 3D Emphasis or Graphic Design should take Arts 151.
6. Recommended electives for Art Education: EDUC 270, ARTS 141, ARTS 151. Recommended electives for Studio Art: ARTS 122, ARTS 125, ARTS 130. Recommended electives for Art History: Additional foreign language if needed. Recommended electives for Graphic Design: Arts 122, Arts 125, ARTS 130, ARTS 141, ARTS 142.
