1. 2.0 Grade Point Average (4.0 scale).

Admission Criteria to the Teacher Education Program

(Note: Admission to the University does not guarantee admission to the Teacher Education Program.)

1. Submit a formal application for University Admission to Teacher Education.
2. A 2.75 (4.0 scale) cumulative GPA based on all work attempted at EIU and a minimum GPA of 2.75 to continue in the English Education program. However, high schools hiring new teachers prefer that GPA's be even higher.

To become a licensed/certified teacher in the State of Illinois, an individual must pass at least three state exams:

1. Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP). Beginning June 30, 2019, the Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP 400) will be put on hold indefinitely.
 - a. The Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) allows students to substitute ACT or SAT test scores for the TAP Test/Basic Skills requirement.
 - b. ACT-Plus Writing minimum requirements: Prior to 9/1/2015 a composite score of 22 and combines English/Writing score of 19. 9/1/15-9/9/16 a composite score of 22 and Writing score of 16. After 9/9/16 a composite score of 22 and Writing score of 6
 - c. SAT minimum requirements: Prior to 3/5/16 a composite score of 1030 and Writing Score of 450. After 3/5/16 a composite score of 1110 and a Writing/Language score of 26
 - d. "Superscoring" is allowed and you may ask your advisor for more information.

Notes:

1. At EIU, all student must have completed a foreign language in either high school or college. This requirement may be met by completing two years of a single foreign language in high school with a grade of C or better, or two semesters of a single foreign language in college. Students who do not have to take two semesters of a Foreign Language should take two additional English electives.
2. All teacher certification majors are required to complete a three (3) hour course in Third World or Non-Western Culture, either in Humanities or Social Science. Choose from POLI 160, GEOG 134, ANTH 103, SOCY 100, or SOCY 201.
3. English (B.A. Language Arts Option for Teacher Certification) majors should choose PSYC 100 Intro to Psychology, HIST 151 U.S. History to 1865, HIST 152 U.S. History Since 1865, or CECN 102 Microeconomic Principles as their Social Sciences options. Your advisor can provide information about additional options.
