Transfer Admission Requirements:

1. 2.0 GPA (4.0 scale). Student will need a higher GPA to be selected for any Science or Pre-Med Major.

Notes:

1. Pre-Medical students may choose any major to receive a Bachelor's Degree. Requirements of the degree and of the college in which it is granted must be met at the same time that Pre-Medical requirements are taken. If a science major is chosen, there will be considerable overlapping of requirements.
2. Community college students are encouraged to complete foreign language and Associate Degree requirements before transferring.
3. The foreign language requirement is waived if a student has completed three years of a single foreign language in high school with a grade of C or above. If the requirement was met in high school, then the student does not need to take foreign language classes at DACC. If the requirement was **not** met in high school, student should take two semesters of one language at DACC.
4. To go along with BIOL 102, BIOL 136 and BIOL 137 (Anatomy & Physiology I and II) are recommended for Pre-Med preparation. This is **not** a **mandatory** requirement. SIUC **prefers** that students take these classes **at SIUC**.
5. Effective Fall 1992, new students or re-entering students absent more than two years and seeking an A.S.A. degree are required to take at least one course with human relations content. See your advisor for a list of courses that fulfill this requirement.
6. Must complete a Human Health requirement for SIU Core. Choose from BIOL 136, BIOL 137, HLTH 101, or HLTH 130. If not taken here at DACC, the student will have to meet this requirement at SIUC.
7. Must complete a Multicultural requirement for SIU Core. The following classes meet this requirement: HIST 151, HIST 170, HIST 190, LITR104, LITR 106, MUSI 120, PHIL 104, SOCY 203, SOCY 225 OR SPCH 141. If not taken here at DACC, the student will have to meet this requirement at SIUC. **NOTE:** This curriculum guide has HIST 151 built in to meet this requirement. It also fulfills the third Social Science elective required to graduate from DACC. **If you choose another elective, then you will have to add another social science elective to graduate from DACC.**
8. Must complete interdisciplinary requirement for SIU Core: BIOL 105 or SOCY 200. This is not built into the DACC guide because there are so many elective hours already; however, if it is not taken at DACC, the student will have to fulfill this requirement at SIUC.
