**Transfer Admission Requirements:**

1. 2.8 Grade Point Average (4.0 scale).
2. Sixty (60) hours of credit.
3. The Online Application is required, but it is strongly encouraged to check deadlines often. Your application will be processed more quickly and you will be able to check its status online.
4. Strong science background is encouraged.

**To become a licensed/certified teacher in the State of Illinois, an individual must pass at least three state exams:**

1. Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP). Beginning June 30, 2019, the Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP 400) will be put on hold indefinitely.
  - a. The Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) allows students to substitute ACT or SAT test scores for the TAP Test/Basic Skills requirement.
  - b. ACT-Plus Writing minimum requirements: Prior to 9/1/2015 a composite score of 22 and combines English/Writing score of 19. 9/1/15-9/9/16 a composite score of 22 and Writing score of 16. After 9/9/16 a composite score of 22 and Writing score of 6
  - c. SAT minimum requirements: Prior to 3/5/16 a composite score of 1030 and Writing Score of 450. After 3/5/16 a composite score of 1110 and a Writing/Language score of 26
  - d. "Superscoring" is allowed and you may ask your advisor for more information.
2. Assessment of Professional Teaching Skills Test (APT)

**NOTES:**

1. Physical Education activity courses (maximum six (6) hours) should include one from each of the following categories: Fitness, dance, gymnastics, swimming, field activities, and racquet activities and may be taken at four-year institution.
2. Physical Education majors may choose from the following areas of concentration: Bioscience, Curriculum and Instruction, Social Science of Sport, or Personalized area of concentration.
3. All teacher certification majors are required to take a three (3) hour course in Third World or Non-Western Culture, either in Humanities or Social Science. Recommended course is LITR 111 Non-Western Literature.
4. Transfer students must have completed third year level of high school or third semester of college of a single foreign language. If foreign language has been completed, students may choose an elective course, including either CBUS 150 or INFO 135. Other recommendations: ANTH 107, LITR 111, PEMW 150, HLTH 130.
5. Elective courses include: HLTH 101, EDUC 101, PEMW 150, PSYC 120, or PEMW course. Please see your advisor for a complete list.
