## **Transfer Admission Requirements:**

1. 2.0 GPA (4.0 scale).
2. Interested students must complete the Social Work Program Application materials and have a personal interview with a member of the faculty.

## **Admission Criteria for Department of Social Work (Admission to the University does not guarantee admission into this program.)**

In order to be accepted as a major in the Bachelor of Social Work degree program, students must satisfy the following requirements.

1. Cumulative GPS of 2.0 or higher.
2. Must earn a grade of C or better in SOCY 202.
3. Provide documentation of 100 hours of volunteer service or work in a human services setting within the past three years. Such settings include churches, summer programs, senior citizen centers, hospitals, etc.
4. Critical thinking and writing skills as demonstrated in coursework and application essays.
5. Interpersonal skills as demonstrated in the classroom, and group interaction and faculty interview.
6. Successful completion of all components of the major application process by the due dates.

### **Notes:**

1. Recommended electives: PSYC 120, PSYC 230, PSYC 240, PSYC 250, SOCY 225, or an additional Humanities or Fine Arts elective.
