KPI Updates

- Nothing new since the last meeting
- Will be updated again in November or December

Tracking New DACC Students by English, Reading, and Mathematics Placements

- Bob has been asked student success rates based on what students have placed into
- Nationally, research shows that students who place into all college level classes are most likely to succeed
 - o This is evident in our data as well
 - All college-level placed students have the highest retention, graduation, and course success rates
- The people that have the worst success levels are those that place into developmental classes in all 3 areas
 - This aligns with the First Year Experience team's recent idea that developmental education students need a mentor whether they want to have one or not
- Bob took the four largest cohorts and disaggregated them based on our usual demographics
 - The major data points that jump out from this
 - First generation students who enter at college level is significantly lower than those who enter with developmental need
 - Black students place into significantly more remedial/developmental course work than their white counterparts
 - Pell-eligible students look like they are spread out across the board
- Select Student Retention and Course Success Rates by Developmental Placement
 - o Rates for all black students are slightly below average across the board
 - Rates for PELL eligible students are slightly above average or average across the board
 - Stacy mentioned with the mentoring program, that African-American students should get first priority

Data Team Memo to the Leadership Team

- Andrew, Bob, and Jessica put this together to highlight information in the KPI and other data that the Data Team feels the Leadership Team should know
- Stacy thinks this information should go to the entire campus after it is approved by the Leadership Team (part of our communication plan)
- Andrew would like to get this to Cindy to present to the Leadership Team at their next October meeting
 - o The team members present think the memo looks good
 - Helps provide data in a narrative format for those who are less numbers people
