ADMISSION CRITERIA TO THE TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAM

(Note: Admission to the University does not guarantee admission to the Teacher Education Program.)

1. All transfer students interested in teacher education must attend a University Admission to Teacher Education meeting within the first 20 days of enrollment at EIU. At this meeting, formal application forms to the Teacher Education Program and important information will be provided.
2. **Selection Process for Teacher Certification.** Before a student is eligible for the selection pool, he/she must meet the criteria to enter the selection pool and must be selected. The criteria to enter the pool are:
 - a. Submit a formal application for University Admission to Teacher Education.
 - b. Establish a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.65 (4.0 scale). Transfer cumulative GPA may be considered if EIU cumulative GPA has not been established.
 - c. For students seeking admission to the EIU Elementary Education cohort program, the following courses **must be completed** prior to applying to EIU: ENGL 101, ENGL 102, SPCH 101 or SPCH 102, MATH 118, PSYC 101, and EDUC 101.

To become a licensed/certified teacher in the State of Illinois, an individual must pass at least three state exams:

1. As of June 30, 2019, the Test of Basic Skills is no longer required to obtain an educator licensure. This includes the SAT and ACT exams. Students will still need to pass the edTPA and content tests in the relevant subject and grade they intend to teach.

NOTES:

1. All teacher certification majors are required to take a three (3) hour course in Third World or Non-Western Culture, either in Humanities or Social Science or area of concentration. Choose from ANTH 103, GEOG 134, SOCY 100, SOCY 201, PSYC 100, or POLI 160. If you plan to apply for the EIU Cohort, GEOG 134 World Regional Geography is required.
2. College students must have had two years of high school foreign language passing with a grade of C or better to be exempt from taking a foreign language.
3. Students will also be required to take MATH 111 to show College Algebra proficiency. If the student has a high enough SAT or ACT score, they do not need to take MATH 111. MATH 115 is not required for Early Childhood if MATH 119 has been completed.
4. ARTS 111, ARTS 112, MUSI 115, MUSI 120, MUSI 121, MUSI 125, or MUSI 126 will also meet this requirement.
5. EIU requires one of the following: LITR 101, LITR 102, LITR 103, LITR 104, LITR 106, LITR 109, LITR 111, LITR 113, LITR 114, LITR 121, or HUMN 101.
6. CHEM 101, or PHYS 101 will also meet this requirement.
7. EIU requires these additional courses. It is highly recommended that you complete these at DACC. Students can choose when to take these courses based on availability.
