Students may choose to continue their pre-professional course work through either the College of ACES or the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. If the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences is chosen to continue the student's studies, the usual Foreign Language requirement that is universal in L.A.S. is in effect, as well as different Humanities and Social Science electives as required by College of LAS. Transfer Admission Requirements:

- 1. The minimum GPA for entry admission consideration will be 2.75 (4.0 scale).
- 2. Sixty (60) semester hours of course work.

ADMISSION CRITERIA FOR THE COLLEGE OF VETERINARY MEDICINE

- 1. Minimum GPA for admission to the UIUC College of Veterinary Medicine is 2.75 on a 4.0 scale. The competitive average, however, is considerably above this level at the present time. (The average is 3.49-3.59.)
- 2. Each applicant must also provide official scores of his performance on the Graduate Record Examination (GRE). Preference for admission will be given to residents of Illinois.
- 3. Subjective criteria are also considered: experience with the veterinary profession, leadership, initiative, extracurricular activities, etc.

NOTES:

- 1. DACC recommends a three-hour course in Third World or Non-Western Culture, either in Humanities or Social Science.
- 2. To graduate from the U of I, the student needs three years of one foreign language in high school, or three semesters of one language in college, or must meet the 3rd Level of Foreign Language requirement to graduate from the U of I.
- 3. Taking a third IAI Social Science and a third Humanities/Fine Arts completes the IAI core requirements.

Applicants are encouraged to apply electronically at aavmc.org/vmcas.htm. Applications are due

October 1. No application will be accepted if post-marked after October 1. The Graduate Record Examination (GRE) is the required entrance test. Please call 1-800-473-2255 to schedule your GRE exam. Test scores must be less than two years old on October 1 of the year you apply and should be mailed to the University. All other application materials, transcripts, and three letters of evaluation must be mailed directly to the College.
