

participated in a multiyear program to
improve the culture
and processes related
to assessment on our
campus.

The program culminated with a 2day Results Forum in St Charles, IL. At this forum our team met with HLC mentors, presented a poster (see page 4) showing our improved assessment cycle, developed a new plan to keep assessment activities at DACC sustainable, and officially graduated from the Academy.









Less than two weeks after completing the HLC Academy, the Assessment Team gave a presentation titled "Bottoms Up - Making Assessment Fun and Engaging" at the annual Assessment Institute in Indianapolis.

We shared our experiences with assessment at DACC and discussed all the changes made in the previous 4 years - designating Champions for each academic division, changing the report forms, incorporating common rubrics and eventually embedding them in our LMS, bringing faculty together for working sessions at the start and end of each semester and more. To keep things fun we also played our official assessment song, let the audience choose one of the competition videos to watch, and shot t-shirts into the audience with a cannon.




Two of our

During the 2024-2025 academic year, faculty met at the end of each semester to work on Program Assessment Report (PAR) forms. The forms were recently redesigned so that each one will tell a complete story of planning, implementation and analysis of the assessment activity used for a particular course or program. This is an improvement over the older version that required a different form for each step of the process.


Each program will begin the new 2025-2026 assessment cycle with a planning session during the fall in-service session.





Year I of LMS integration

This past year, faculty were able to create assessment activities and submit their data through Blackboard/Canvas using a Watermark product called Student Learning & Licensure (SL&L). With this integration, class rosters are automatically populated, faculty choose the appropriate rubric elements, and the data is instantly compiled for anyone who needs to access it. A few snapshots of the 2024-2025 Critical Thinking assessment results from the physical science program are shown below. A full data report from the year with results from all four college-wide general education outcomes (GEOs) will be available shortly, so keep an eye out for that!
